Foster Listening Habit

Build listening skills through games. Games such as Simon says and Chinese ears help your child to build listening skills in a fun and rewarding way. For example ask your child to find objects around the house by giving them two verbal instructions, then gradually progress to third part For example; Go to the kitchen, open the first shelf, take out blue plate, come to the dining area and at last keep it on the table.



Foster Reading Habit

Developing reading skills early on sets the stage for future success. Make reading interactive at home to foster a lifelong love of learning!. Read books every day and let your child predict the ending or retell the best part of the story. Give them newspaper cutting and tell them to highlight sight words like *I*, *he*, *she*, *my* and *it*.





Foster Speaking Habit

Encourage your child to talk in English at home, using simple sentences. We teachers are trying to teach the children to use simple sentences like:

- May I come in ma'am?
- May I quench my thirst?
 - May I have my lunch/fruit?
 - I am not feeling well.
 - Give me a pencil, please.
 - May I borrow your pencil?
 - May I go to ease myself?

Similarly, children can be encouraged to use simple words and sentences at home too, like:

- Mumma, please give me something to eat.
- May I have a glass of water please?
- I am feeling sleepy.
- I am hungry/famished.
- May I watch Television?
- My stomach is aching.







Foster Social and Emotional Skills

Encourage your child to take care of his/her personal hygiene by inculcating habits like Covering his/her nose while sneezing, Trimming nails on regular basis, Washing hands frequently, Wishing and welcoming guests, Spending time with grandparents/cousins etc

Activity

Word Fun

This activity makes learning fun, where kids can learn words very easily. Activity:

A sand/salt tray is another great tool to use to learn words. The feel of the rough sand or salt helps kinesthetic learners memorize the words.

Things required:

- Some sand/salt or semolina
- Empty Tray

Directions:

Take a bowl of some sand/salt/ semolina.

Spread the sand/salt/ semolina into the empty tray.

- Use index finger, trace the words on the tray as shown in the picture.

Activities

Hopscotch Game :

Write down numbers on the floor ask your child to first identify and then hop to the number you will say. For example, when you will say, "Hop to the number that comes before 5," your child has to identify that the number is 4 and then hop towards the number.



Number Line Race:

Create a number line with the set of ten numbers like. 1 to 10, 10 to 20 on the floor using tape or chalk.

Child takes turns rolling 2 dice and moving that many spaces.

To practice "before" and "after", ask child what number they were on before their turn and what number they will be on after their turn.

Spat the Numbers:

Write down some numbers on the board/floor, and the child has to tell me what comes after each number. For example, if you Say '5', then the child has spat the number '6'.





Before and After Cards:

Create cards with numbers from 1 to 60. Shuffle the cards and place them face down. Players take turns drawing a card and saying the number that comes before and after the drawn number.

For example, if the player draws 30, they should say 29 and 31. If the player answers correctly, they keep the card.

Recepie:

Ingredients:

1 precooked pizza crust,

1/4 cup pizza sauce

1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese

Olives, sliced onion.

Green bell pepper, thinly sliced or the vegetables of their choice.

Directions:

1. Heat the oven to 450 degrees F.

2. Cut the pizza crust into 2 tie shapes. This is easiest if you make a template out of paper first.

3. Let the kids spread each tie with a tablespoon of tomato sauce and sprinkle them with 1/4 cup of cheese.

4. Now the kids can choose the toppings to make their design.

5. Top the additional scraps of crust with remaining sauce, cheese and toppings.

6. Bake the pizza pieces on a pan for about 8 minutes, until the cheese has melted and is just turning golden in a few spots.








SNAKES AND LADDERS
